Scotland (in English) or Alba (in Scottish Gaelic, an old language some people still speak in this part of the UK) is one third of the island of Great Britain and one fourth of the whole of the UK. It shares a border in the south with England and the rest of Scotland is surrounded by water. Scotland has got more than 790 small islands by its coast and the capital in Edinburgh, which is not the biggest city.

The Scots have got a strong national identity. They have got their own flag, language and national symbols. The flag is a white cross on blue, a thistle is the plant symbol and a unicorn is an animal symbol of Scotland. They have got a patron saint as well – St Andrew.

Scottish people are proud of their traditions – clothes, music, dance and food. It is the Scottish male traditional clothes that are so exciting – men in skirts! They usually wear a tartan skirt with knee-length socks. They also wear a waistcoat and a jacket. Women wear long skirts and a blouse. Men like playing bagpipes, a traditional wind instrument. Its sound is very characteristic and shows the spirit of Scotland. They also dance traditional Scottish dances - very energetic and unique.

Traditional Scottish cuisine is very unusual, too. A traditional dish is *haggis* – a pudding prepared of sheep’s insides, oatmeal, onion, spices and fat. They serve it on special occasions.

When you think about Scotland, you can’t forget about the beautiful landscapes – mountains, with the highest Ben Nevis, green hills, valleys and spectacular silver lakes, or lochs as they are called there.
