Rollerblading is great fun and a good exercise, too. It's also a good means of transport. You can play hockey, basketball or even dance when you are on your rollerblades.

To be good at rollerblading you should prepare yourself well. It's good to practice on the carpet or on the grass before you go on your first ride. Buy a helmet and good pads for your knees, wrists and elbows and wear them every time you go rollerblading. You can also take some lessons or watch some instructions on YouTube.

The most important skill you need to learn is how to stop and balance. To stop you have to bend your knees and put your heels down. If you want to go faster you should be good at balancing too, so you have to practice standing on one foot for as long as you can. When you are good enough, you can ride in marathons and win prizes.

One of the best rollerbladers of all time is Chris Haffey, age 34 now, who started his adventure with skating before the age of 11. In 2011, he broke the world record for the longest jump on rollerblades. He jumped 30 metres in the air and landed successfully. Between 2002-2011, he took part in more than 30 competitions and won 21 gold, 8 silver and 1 bronze medals.
