Australia is a very interesting continent-country with many curiosities. One of them is an underground town with three and a half thousand inhabitants. Almost 80% of them have underground houses.

Coober Pedy is a town in Southern Australia on the Stuart Highway. It is over 100 years old and its history began with a discovery of opal gemstone. People still go there to look for treasure. Most of the world’s opals are mined in Coober Pedy. Every year there’s Coober Pedy Opal Festival at the end of March.

People who decided to stay and live in Coober Pedy started looking for a way to survive the unbearable heat of Australian interior. The temperatures rise up to 45 degrees Celsius in the shade there. Fortunately, people quickly adapted to such extreme conditions and instead of running away, they started to dig holes in the ground to create cool places to hide and live. They became a very popular type of houses with quite cool temperature inside. Such cave-like residences are called “dugouts”.

They’re much more friendly than regular houses. The temperature in a dugout is about 24 degrees Celsius. There’re no windows, it is peaceful and quiet. They can be real labyrinths sometimes with many rooms and even an underground swimming pool. People have living rooms, bedrooms, kitchens, bathrooms, studies, dining rooms and many more in their unusual homes. Some people don’t have regular furniture but they carve the shelves, beds or stairs in the stone walls.

The idea of living this way is so exciting that it attracts many tourists who want to experience living underground and book rooms in the underground hotels.

As a result not only the houses are under the surface - the whole city with museums, churches, hotels, shops and restaurants is there! The mysterious town looks like from a movie scene; in fact, it is so inspiring for film directors that they shoot their films there as well.
